Dear Leader Schumer, Leader McConnell, Speaker Pelosi, and Leader McCarthy,

As former diplomacy and national security professionals, we write to you to convey our strong support for passage of a State Department authorization bill this year.

We appreciate your work to include the Department of State Authorization Act of 2021 (H.R. 1157) in the FY22 National Defense Authorization Act (P.L. 117-81). The successful enactment of the Department of State Authorization Act for the first time in almost twenty years is particularly notable due to its bipartisan support at an especially partisan time, and we are grateful for your work to prioritize diplomacy in America's foreign policy toolkit. It is critical that Congress build upon this momentum and pass another State Department authorization bill this year.

As you know, State Department authorization legislation is essential for Congress to exercise its critical oversight function and influence of American foreign policy. As the United States confronts a critical juncture in world affairs, the Department of State Authorization Act of 2022 presents an important opportunity for Congress to articulate American foreign policy objectives and approach. This bill has strong bipartisan support and will make important updates and improvements to State Department authorities, functions, and practices such as the Accountability Review Board process, recruitment and retention of a diverse workforce, cyber diplomacy capabilities, and the United States' global diplomatic posture.

The world has changed dramatically in the twenty years that elapsed between the two most recent State Department authorization bills. Yet, until last year, the State Department was still operating under the authorities granted to it in the 2002 iteration of the State Department authorization legislation.

One-off authorization every two decades is not nearly enough to keep up with today's global challenges, and we cannot afford to lose this opportunity to pass another State Department authorization bill. By not regularly passing authorizing legislation, we harm our national security, we weaken our ability to agilely respond to new international threats, and we handicap our U.S. foreign service professionals.

We sincerely thank you for your commitment to principled American foreign policy. We stand ready to work with you, and we respectfully urge you to show decisive leadership and support swift passage of a State Department authorization bill this year.
